MoH: Quarantined migrant worker dies from heart attack

The Ministry of Health has confirmed that a male migrant worker who died while in quarantine in Tbong Khmum Province had a heart attack that led to his death on Saturday.

The 52 years-old victim was in guarantine after he crossed the Odor Meanchev border from Thailand on December 28. He was tested for COVID-19 and the result was negative.

According to the forensic examination conducted on the dead body of the victim, he had a heart attack causing him to fall on the floor. Health authorities concluded that after he passed out and fell on the floor, his head got hurt and bled.

Further information released by the health ministry said that he was checked on Saturday morning as part of the daily health procedures but no indication of any health problem. His dead body was found in the toilet after authorities did not notice him in his room.

Victim's wife confessed that the victim had a history of heart problem and had visited doctors in Thailand about his heart condition.
